Salahuddin Malik was born in the Punjab and received his MA in History from Punjab University, Lahore, before completing his Ph.D. in British imperial history at McGill University, Montreal. He has taught in Pakistan and Canada and is currently professor of history at the State University of New York College, Brockport. His teaching interests are centred on South and Southwest Asian history.

He has published over a dozen scholarly articles in various journals and works currently in progress include a study of Muslim nationalism in India, 1757-1857; various research articles on the British period of Indian history; Pakistani Americans; and Islam in America and its future.

The author has been intensely involved in Pakistani and Islamic organizations in the United States. He was a founding member and trustee of the American Institute of Pakistan Studies, the Pakistani American Congress, the Council on Islamic Education, the Pakistan America Institute, the Islamic Center of Rochester and past member, Majlis ash Shura, Islamic Society of North America. He is a past president of both the Association of Muslim Social Scientists of North America and New York State Association of Asian Studies. Currently, he serves on the Executive Board of the New York Conference on Asian Studies and is chairman, Council of Trustees, the Islamic Center of Rochester.
