Several Doctoral Research Fellowships (incl. Islam and the Islamic World), University of Oslo

A -- A position as doctoral research fellow in Islam and the Islamic World is available at the Department of Culture Studies and Oriental Languages, Faculty of Humanities, University of Oslo <http://www.hf.uio.no/ikos/english/index.html>.

The successful candidates should in her/his research project work on a topic related to Islam and the Islamic world. Applicants should document necessary language competence to carry out the project. The applicant's doctoral research project should preferably be related to one of the ongoing research projects at the department (see <http://www.hf.uio.no/ikos/english/research/>).

The position is available for a period of three years. Candidates who are accepted must participate in the researcher education programme (cf. regulations and supplementary provisions for the faculty's researcher education). Research fellows will have their workplace and academic contact person at the relevant Department.

Government wage scale: 43-50 (from NOK 358 800 to NOK 367 800)

Closing date for applications: 14 March 2008

The University of Oslo also has a goal of recruiting more immigrants to Norway in academic positions. Immigrants are encouraged to apply.
